Guidelines for Submission

- 1. *Humanitas Taiwanica* welcomes essays from all disciplines of the humanities: literature, history, philosophy, art, music, theater studies, linguistics, anthropology, library and information science, and other humanities-related disciplines.
- 2. Published semi-annually (in May and November), *Humanitas Taiwanica* accepts submissions year-round, and welcomes submissions from scholars in and outside of Taiwan. Submitted manuscripts must not have been previously published elsewhere; those that have been published on the web will not be accepted. If an author wishes to submit a manuscript that has been previously presented at a conference, please make sure that the conference organizer has no plan to publish the conference proceedings. In the event of any violation of academic ethics, such as duplicate submission or plagiarism, future submissions of the author will not be considered. After a paper is published, the author of the accepted paper will receive one complimentary copy of the issue in which the paper appears and twenty complimentary offprints of the paper. The author receives no payment for the publication, and is not charged with any publication fees.
- 3. *Humanitas Taiwanica* adopts a double-blind peer review for all submitted manuscripts. All submissions will be reviewed initially by the editorial committee, and then sent to two experts for double-blind review. Please do not include any personal or identifying information of the author in the manuscript. The editorial committee will make the final decision based on the comments of the reviewers and notify the author of the decision. For papers that have passed the review, *Humanitas Taiwanica* may adjust their time of publication when necessary, according to the number of accepted papers for each issue.
- 4. Submissions must be written in either traditional Chinese or English.

Manuscripts of Chinese essays should be 10,000 to 30,000 traditional Chinese characters (as opposed to bytes, inclusive of footnotes and Chinese and English abstracts, and exclusive of bibliography), and manuscripts of English essays should be 3,000 to 8,000 words. Translations or reviews of important academic works may also be considered, but should be supplemented with critical commentaries and expository annotations.

- 5. Should any part of a submission include copyright materials (such as images or quotations exceeding a certain length), please secure written permissions from the copyright holders before submission. Copyright permissions are not the responsibility of *Humanitas Taiwanica*.
- 6. All submissions should be completed with the following information in both Chinese and English: title, abstract (no more than 300 Chinese characters and 200 words in English), and keywords (no more than five for each abstract), font size of all of which should be 12 point. Please be sure to format submissions according to the journal's "Style Guide." Please format submissions in English according to *The Chicago Manual of Style*.
- 7. Prior to the submission, please fill out the "Contributor Information Form" available for download at the journal's Webpage. For electronic submissions, please have a clear scanned form (with signature in the author's own handwriting) emailed to *Humanitas Taiwanica* along with the submission.
- 8. Submissions may be made by emailing a digital version of the paper in Word and PDF formats or by posting three hard copies along with a CD containing a digital version of the paper in Word and PDF format. Please be advised that the submitted hard copies will not be returned. Mailing Address:

- 9. Articles published in *Humanitas Taiwanica* may not be reprinted, translated, republished, or reproduced in any form without written permission from the journal. The authors, however, retain the rights to republish the papers in other publications and to use the papers for Internet transmission or self-archiving. Upon republication, the authors should acknowledge the original publication of the works in *Humanitas Taiwanica*.
- 10. Humanitas Taiwanica is an academic journal with free open online access. For each issue, both the physical and digital formats are published simultaneously at "<u>http://homepage.ntu.edu.tw/~bcla/eng</u>." Authors whose manuscripts are accepted for publishing in *Humanitas Taiwanica* must agree to grant authorization for the editing, reproduction, translation, public transmission and database archiving of the articles in physical and digital formats to the National Taiwan University College of Liberal Arts, National Taiwan University Press (NTU Press), and other collaborated organizations authorized by the National Taiwan University College of Liberal Arts or NTU Press. The authors must agree to allow the database users to browse, download, and print the published articles. Authors publishing with *Humanitas Taiwanica* must consent to grant a free license to NTU Press to publish the articles in physical and digital formats for the articles in physical and digital formats.
