- ECFA: Economic Co-operation Framework Agreement
- Signed in June 30, 2010
- ECFA is an FTA agreement

- Over the next two years China will lower tariffs for 539 categories of imports, worth \$13.8 billion a year
- Taiwan will lift tariffs for only 267 categories of imports from China, worth \$2.9 billion.
- \$13.8 billion is 3.2% of Taiwan's GDP:
 Taiwan's GDP (2010): 430.45 billion
