

Opening of a Faculty Position in the Department of Plant Pathology and Microbiology, National Taiwan University, Taipei, Taiwan

A faculty position in the Department of Plant Pathology and Microbiology, National Taiwan University is available at the level of ASSISTANT PROFESSOR, ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, or PROFESSOR, beginning from February 1, 2013. The areas of interest include: the study of edible and medicinal mushrooms, applications of secondary metabolites from microorganisms, plant growth-promoting microorganisms, or other fields related to applied microbiology. The successful applicant will be expected to contribute to the teaching mission of the department, to conduct research programs, and to participate in the department service. Applicants should have a Ph. D. degree, and more than one year of postdoctoral training or related research experience. To apply, please send a cover letter, two letters of reference (including one from the thesis advisor if apply for the position of “Assistant Professor”), and three copies of the following documents: (1) curriculum vitae, (2) Ph.D. diploma or a certificate of the Ph.D. degree, (3) a publication list, (4) teaching plans, (5) research proposals, (6) at most 10 hard prints of the latest seven-year publications (published after February 1, 2006) to the address shown below. The cover letter should indicate the position to apply and the title of the designated representative paper (published after February 1, 2008). If a Ph.D. dissertation is designated as a representative publication for the application of the position of “Assistant Professor”, official transcripts for both undergraduate and graduate studies should be enclosed.
